Location: Albert Hall, E. Jacinto Street cor. Lakandula Street. UP Diliman, Quezon City, 1101 Philippines
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On 24 August 1995, the Board of Regents approved the proposal to establish the Archaeological Studies Program (ASP)^a in U.P. Diliman. The Program oversees and coordinates instructional, research, and extension activities pertaining to the systematic discovery, reclamation, analysis, interpretation, and preservation of the material remains of ancestral Southeast Asian and Filipino cultures. Established as an intercollegiate and inter-disciplinary program, ASP is headed by a Director and is attached to the Office of the Chancellor. It has a Coordinating Council to develop and administer the degree programs offered. The Council is chaired by the Chancellor, with the Deans of the following colleges as members: Archaeological Studies Program, College of Arts and Letters, College of Engineering, College of Science, College of Social Science and Philosophy, College of Architecture, and Asian Center.

PROGRAMS OFFERED

Diploma in Archaeology

It is a one-year program for the following:

- 1) students who are interested in pursuing a graduate degree in archaeology, but who are constrained to pursue a higher graduate degree in view of the demands and/or requirements of their full-time jobs and
- 2) those who want to pursue a Ph.D. in Archaeology, but whose master's degree is not in archaeology.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY PROGRAM

Master in Archaeology (MA & MS)

The course is offered to students who want a formal training in archaeology, archaeological research, and extension activities pertaining to the systematic discovery, reclamation, analysis, interpretation, and preservation of the material remains of our cultural past.

PhD in Archaeology

It is offered to students who have the potential to be leaders and trendsetters in heritage research and who have the capabilities to transform the landscape of heritage work and maintain technical competence for basic research.

ADMISSION POLICIES/REQUIREMENTS

The general rules of the University on admission are followed for all applicants. In addition, all applicants have to undergo interviews and evaluation by a screening committee.

Applicants whose respective master's degrees are in other disciplines must first take all the core courses required for the Diploma in Archaeology before they can apply for the PhD in Archaeology program.

Additional Requirement for a PhD Program Applicant

A research proposal as a basis in assessing the applicant's research readiness to complete a PhD in Archaeology

Units earned in the Diploma program may be credited to the MA/MS program.

210 Statistics in Archaeology. The use of statistics in exploration, excavation and analysis of materials for report writing. Prereq: Archaeo 201, 204/COI. 3 u.

211 Computer Programs in Archaeology. The use of computer programs in aid of exploration, excavation, and analysis of materials for report writing. Prereq: Archaeo 201, 204/COI. 3u.

218 Ethnoarchaeology. Comparative studies of living ethnic groups and archaeological material culture. Prereq: COI. 3 u.

219 Museology. Principles of organization and administration of archaeological collections (cross-listed with Anthro 219). 3 u.

220 Philippine Prehistoric Archaeology. Prereq: Archaeo 201, 204/COI. 3 u.

221 Stone Ages. The earliest cultural phases of humankind indicated by archaeological remains up to sedentarism and domestication, chronology, paleo-ecology and technology, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

222 Metal Ages. The earliest evidence of the use of metals, diverse theories on the origin of metallurgy, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

224 Southeast Asian Prehistoric Archaeology. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

230 Complex Societies in Southeast Asia. Evolution, organization, and archaeology of ancient states. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI.3u.

231 Settlement Patterns and Household Systems in Southeast Asia. Archaeological sites distribution and household systems. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

234 Archaeology of Trade. Trade patterns and exchange systems in the archaeological context, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

240 Human Palaeontology. Biocultural evolutionary stages of humans, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, COI. 3 u.

241 Mortuary Analysis in Archaeology. Theories and methods in the analysis of skeletal remains and human burial practices, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, 240. 3u.

242 Archaeobiological Remains. Study of botanical and faunal remains, with emphasis on Southeast Asia. Prereq: Archaeo 201, 240. 3 u.

243 Lithic Analysis. Methods, techniques, and theoretical discourses in the analysis of lithic implements. Prereq: Archaeo 204. 3 u.

244 Ceramic Analysis. Methods, techniques, and theoretical discourses in the analysis of ceramic materials. Prereq: Archaeo 204. 3 u.

245 Geoarchaeology. Concepts, theories, and techniques in understanding different processes that contribute to archaeological site formation. Prereq: Archaeo 206. 3 u.

- 250 Historical Archaeology.** The aims, methods and rationale of the sub-field of historical archaeology. Prereq: Core courses and/or COI. 3 u.
- 251 Underwater Archaeology in Southeast Asia.** History, concepts, and methods in underwater archaeology. Prereq: Core courses and/or COI and students must be certified divers. 3 u.
- 260 Archaeological Resource Management.** Identification, preservation and protection of archaeological resources. Prereq: Core course and/or COI. 3 u.
- 269 Archaeological Applications of Geology.** Applications of geological principles, concepts, and laboratory methods to archaeology. Prereq: Archaeo 201; Coreq: Archaeo 204. 7 h. (1 lec, 6 lab). 3 u.
- 270 Readings in Archaeology.** Concentration on a specific topic for research purposes. Prereq: Core courses and/or COI. 3 u.; may be taken more than once provided the topics are different and the latter shall be indicated for record purposes.
- 297 Special Topics in Archaeology.** Prereq: COI. 3 u.; may be taken more than once provided the topics are different and the latter shall be indicated for record purposes.
- 298 Special Topics in Regional Archaeology.** The archaeology of a region or country, with discussions on its cultural chronology, major archaeological sites, and material remains. 3 u; may be taken a number of times, provided the region/country is different.
- 299 Research.** 3 u.
- 300 Master's Thesis.** 6 u.
- 301 Advanced Field Methods.** Methods in managing, leading, and integrating archaeological field excavation and methodology. 3u.
- 302 Heritage Management.** In-depth study of the different issues confronting world heritage management. 3u.
- 399 Independent Study.** A research-focused course that will allow Ph.D. students to develop their research interests. 3 u; must be taken twice.
- 400 Ph.D. Dissertation.** 12 u.
