OFFICE OF THE VICE CHANCELLOR FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS

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The office guides and supports students throughout their stay in the University. The various units under the OVCSA cover concerns relevant to student life such as scholarships, student housing, counseling, mentoring, food services, opportunities for part-time work, student organizations and campus activities.

Various activities are also organized by the OVCSA in coordination or partnership with the colleges, the University Student Council and college councils to make students aware of available student services on campus.

SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANTS

The Office of Scholarships and Grants (OSG) offers support programs for students in need of financial assistance. The OSG programs include:

Socialized Tuition (ST) System

The ST System provides tuition discounts at rates that are based on the assessment of the paying capacity of the household to which a student belongs. This assessment looks at the income as well as the socio-economic characteristics of the household.

Private- and Government-funded Scholarship Grants

Scholarships provide various modes of financial support, such as tuition subsidy, monthly stipends, book allowances and other semestral benefits that students will need to continue studying in UP. Scholarship grants are often based on merit as determined through the academic performance of the applicant.

Student Assistantships: Student assistantships provide additional allowance for students who are willing to work in different offices of UP Diliman. Qualified student assistants can render service for a maximum of 120 hours per month at a rate of Php 60 per hour.

Student Loan

Students who experience difficulties in relation to paying their tuition and other academic-related expenditures may apply for student loans at "student-friendly" payment schemes.

Adopt-a-Student Program

The Program, through the Diliman Committee on Scholarships and Financial Assistance (DCSFA) grants additional allowances to students with urgent financial needs during the semester. Depending on the financial status of the beneficiary, the committee can provide at least Php 2,000 per month to each qualified student.

DOST Core Group

The Core Group attends to the DOST Scholars who are enrolled in UP Diliman. It monitors the scholars' academic performance, facilitates the release of their stipends and manages the Science and Technology Learning Assistance Program.

STUDENT HOUSING

The Office of Student Housing (OSH) manages the residence halls in UP Diliman. The residence halls provide an atmosphere conducive to sound intellectual, physical, emotional, spiritual, social and cultural pursuits. They are living laboratories on campus where students are able to integrate the interplay between academic and non-academic learning experiences.

The residence halls' built-in program of activities and services complement the academic programs of the University and capture the essential elements of a "home away from home" where our student-residents obtain an enriching group living experience.

The OSH operates twelve (12) residence halls on campus. Of these, the Kalayaan Residence Hall houses first year students. It operates on a single-fee system, a payment scheme that covers board and lodging costs.

Since 2015, the OVCSA through OSH has sustained the Project BalikUPDorm, in which past residents celebrate and contribute to the continued enrichment of the UP Diliman dormitory life.

The Office of Student Projects and Activities (OSPA) facilitates student leadership programs, provides administrative support for the University Student Council (USC), and acts as Secretariat for the conduct of the yearly USC Elections and the Philippine Collegian Editorial Examination.

The office also coordinates with about 200 registered university-based student organizations. Student organizations are categorized as academic, alliance, cause-oriented, community service, dormitory association, fraternity, regional/provincial, religious, special interest, sorority, sports and recreation. Depending on their inclinations and needs, freshmen may opt to join student organizations to help them adjust to university life, or to defer joining until after they have adjusted in order to enrich their university experience
